A tornado is a rotating column of air that forms a funnel shape and can be very dangerous.

If you experience one:

- Go to a basement, closet, or bathroom
- Stay away from windows
- Cover yourself with blankets
- Protect your head the best you can

A thunderstorm is big storm that can create a variety of weather including large pieces of ice (called "hail"), lightning, flooding, strong winds, or tornadoes.

If you see lightning or hear thunder:

- Get inside a building or car
- Stay away from windows, trees and water.
- If you are outside without a safe place, crouch down with only your feet on the ground. Get as low as you can.



Flooding is a lot of water that fills the area and is caused by excessive rain. Floods often come after a thunderstorm.

If you see flooding:

- Do not try to walk in the water
- Do not play in the water
- Get to a higher place than the water (up some stairs or on a deck)
- Never let your parents or grandparents drive through a flooded road
